

## The Gareth Jones Memorial Travelling Scholarship

This Scholarship is provided from the income of a Memorial Fund raised by public subscription to perpetuate the memory of Gareth Richard Vaughan Jones, a graduate of the University of Wales, who met his death at the hand of bandits in Inner Mongolia, 12 August, 1935.

- 1. The Gareth Jones Memorial Scholarship will be awarded annually by UWRET to a graduate of a Welsh University provided a suitable candidate is forthcoming.
- 2. The Scholarship will be of the value of approximately £2,000<sup>1</sup> payable in two instalments. The period of the tenure of the Scholarship shall be decided by UWRET.
- 3. The object of the Scholarship is to enable the holder to travel in foreign countries with a view to facilitating his/her study of international relations. No obligation to pursue a specific scheme of study shall be attached to the award of the Scholarship.
- 4. Preference will be given to a graduate who signifies his/her intention to pursue or continue a scheme of study in preparation for work in journalism bearing on international affairs or for entry into State or other services relating to international affairs.
- 5. The holder of the Scholarship shall, at the conclusion of his/her tenure, submit a report of the work to UWRET.
- 6. Applications for the award of the Scholarship must reach UWRET, University Of Wales Registry, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF10 3NS, on or before 1 June.<sup>2</sup>

Any reference in these regulations to 'Welsh Universities' (or  $\alpha$  'Welsh University') shall mean former accredited institutions of the University of Wales or other Universities registered in Wales

- 1. The actual value of the award will be subject to available funds.
- 2. In some years the deadline may be extended.

These regulations are formed on the basis of the original bequest. When making an award, Trustees may apply discretion and interpret the bequest for modern times.
